Student's Union

Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) demonstrates a strong commitment to student representation and democratic engagement, aligning closely with the principles outlined in the QS Student Union metric. The university has established a comprehensive and decentralized structure for student participation, ensuring that students are actively involved in institutional life through organized and representative bodies.

Student representation at BAU is managed under the supervision of [the Deanship of Student Affairs](#), which oversees multiple student unions, clubs, and associations across all faculties and campuses. These bodies function as a recognized student union structure at the university level, representing both undergraduate and postgraduate students. They serve as a vital link between students and university administration, advocate student interests, organize events, and provide a wide range of academic and social support services.

Through this inclusive framework, BAU ensures broad representation, including international students and students with disabilities, while fostering leadership development and civic engagement. The structure enables students to participate in decision-making processes and leadership roles, with elected representatives in various student bodies, reflecting democratic practices consistent with QS requirements.

This integrated system highlights BAU's dedication not only to fulfilling the core requirement of having a recognized student union, but also to fostering an active, participatory, and democratically engaged student community.



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Democratic Student Representation at BAU

Student scientific associations exist at faculties of Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) to serve as academic extracurricular support agencies for their student population. The university officially provides "**Instructions for Student Scientific Associations at Al-Balqa Applied University**" with specific rules governing these associations.

Democratic Student Representation at BAU: Annual Election Process

The Student Scientific Associations in BAU colleges successfully carry out democratic student representation through their yearly voting processes. The elections function under leadership from the Dean of Student Affairs and the Higher Elections Committee to provide students with governance participation. Student representatives embrace three duties following their election: addressing academic and scientific matters, improving cultural and social activities, and enhancing student-administrator and student-faculty relationships. The method promotes democratic principles while fostering student involvement across the university space according to BAU's commitment to these values.



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Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) has established comprehensive regulations governing student scientific associations, as outlined in the official document titled "Instructions for Student Scientific Associations at Al-Balqa Applied University." These regulations were enacted based on the decision of the University's Council of Deans No. 2018/2017/510, dated February 5, 2018.

Key Provisions of the Regulations:

1- Establishment and Objectives:

Each college within BAU forms a "Student Scientific Association" to represent its students, with its headquarters located on the college campus.

2- The objectives of these associations include:

- Representing students and addressing their academic concerns with the college administration.
- Participating in supporting the academic, cultural, and social journey of university students.
- Providing opportunities for positive academic interaction between students, faculty, staff, and the college administration.



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- Fostering a spirit of dialogue, respect for diverse opinions, and enhancing cooperation.
- Encouraging participation in various purposeful student activities that contribute to the advancement of the educational process.
- Promoting a sense of belonging to the nation and its leadership.
- Facilitating constructive engagement with local communities and their institutions, in coordination with the college administration, to achieve the university's goals.
- Collaborating with the college administration to provide assistance to needy students, with prior approval.
- Maintaining the university's reputation and property.

3. Membership and Elections:

- The General Assembly comprises students enrolled in the college seeking a degree (Bachelor's or Diploma) and attending classes.
- The Administrative Body of the association consists of elected members from the General Assembly, with a minimum of five members and not exceeding the number of academic departments in the college.



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4. Eligibility criteria for candidacy include:

- A cumulative GPA of at least "Good."
- Enrollment in at least 12 credit hours during the election semester.
- Completion of at least one semester at the college.
- At least two semesters remaining before graduation, excluding the election semester.
- No prior disciplinary actions.

5.Operational Guidelines:

- Associations must operate within the university's regulations and are prohibited from engaging in activities beyond their specified objectives.
- Meetings and activities should be conducted on campus in designated areas approved by the college administration.
- Members are expected to adhere to university regulations, association bylaws, and work towards achieving the association's goals.

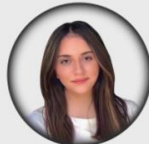

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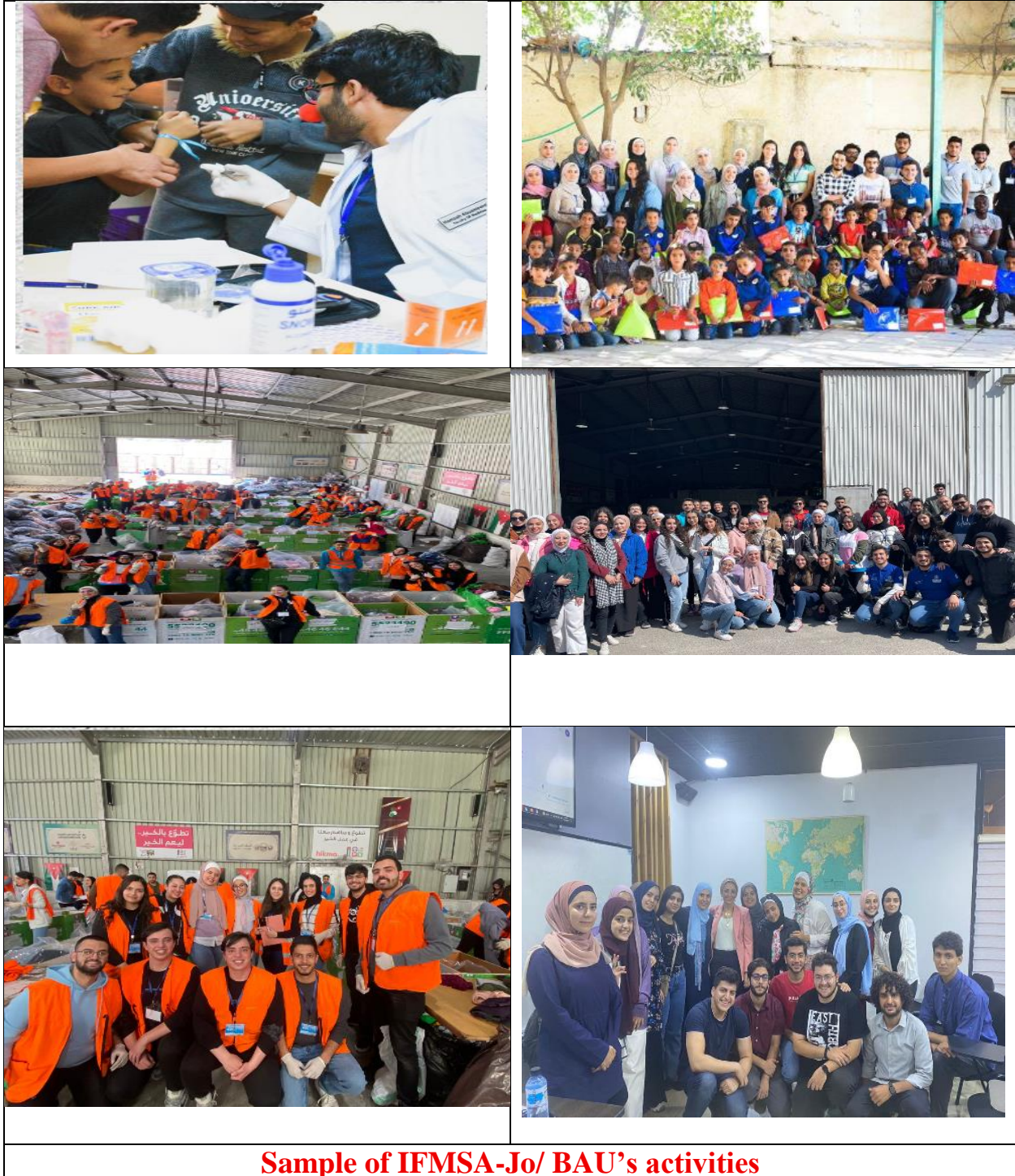

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

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BAU-LC operates under IFMSA-Jo as six separate Standing Committees whose mission is to tackle fundamental public health and sustainable development aspects. Through its activities, SCOPH (Public Health) conducts health education programs that include World Health Day observance and anti-smoking initiatives targeting preventive medical services and health enhancement. Through the BAU-LC integration into IFMSA-Jo, the organization has taken an important step that ensures sustainability, combined with equity and innovation, penetrates all aspects of student life. BAU strengthens its position as Jordan's transformative higher education institution by developing medical leaders with academic excellence, social consciousness, and a global worldview. The union stands as an example that shows students can lead meaningful change that becomes vital to national development and global well-being.

- SCORA implements health education programs about AIDS prevention and reproductive health rights while delivering educational content on sensitive subjects.
- The SCORP organization defends human rights and promotes peace by delivering workshops and organizing campaigns. It also engages in



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volunteering activities focused on helping refugees and marginalized population groups.

- SCOME's medical education division functions to improve teaching excellence by organizing peer-to-peer educational programs, conducting curriculum assessments, and pursuing educational programs that focus on student-centered learning.
- COPE & SCORE (Professional and Research Exchange) creates transformative overseas exchange programs that enhance academic and cultural development for BAU students while enabling them to conduct clinical and research activities abroad.

These student union committees develop leadership abilities, research skills, and volunteer opportunities for BAU-involved students, building their capabilities to support local communities and global society.



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Another key example is the IEEE Al-Balqa Applied University Center Branch.

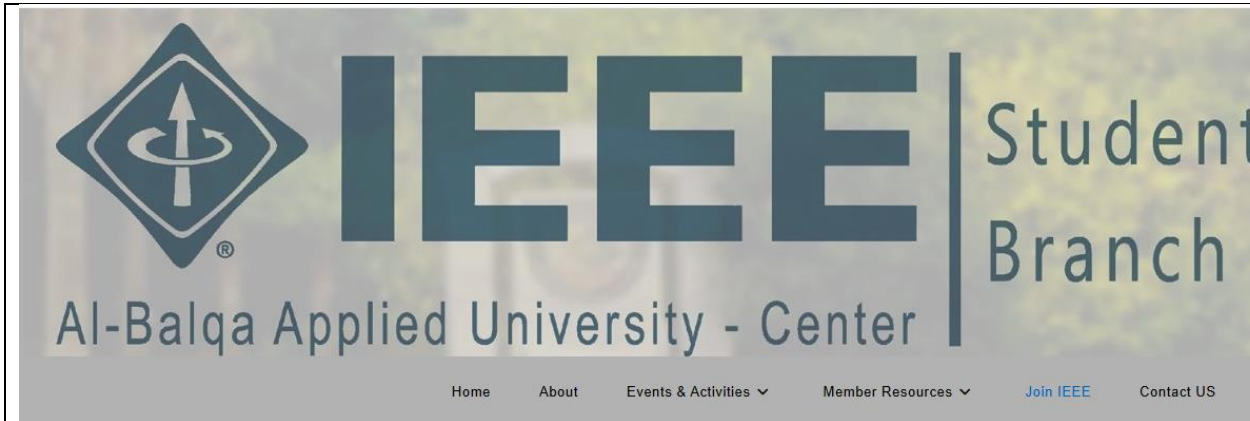
The IEEE Student Branch at Al-Balqa Applied University (BAU) represents a dynamic platform for fostering technological innovation, professional development, and student engagement within the global engineering community. Since its founding, the BAU IEEE branch has grown to include more than 90 members, led by a team of 13 officers who organize and manage its diverse activities. The branch has actively contributed to student development through participation in major events such as the IEEE Grand Tech Conference, organizing technical visits like those to the National Electricity Company, and delivering specialized training courses, including MATLAB workshops at the Faculty of Engineering.
